COUNTY LEGISLTOR REPORT:

The paving in the street project for Glenfield was awarded to Central Paving out of Herkimer. Their bid was 3 million and were awarded that amount. Letter being sent to them. Martinsburg get your things in order that need to be done before the project starts. Negotiations with the county continue for plowing both Martinsburg and county plow 2 miles ea. Rate to be 7,560 per mile and includes sweeping in the spring if no sweeping is needed its 360 less so it would be 7,200 per mile. Discussion still on going with county on taking over town roads and bridges.

There will be a public hearing at the June meeting to hear comments on abolishing the Events Law.

BOARD RESOLUTION OF TOWN OF MARTINSBURG

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE APPLICATION FOR THE RESTORE NY COMMUNITIES' INITIATIVE

As of this 15 day of May 2024, the following resolutions were duly adopted at a Town of Martinsburg Board meeting:

WHEREAS, Empire State Development Corporation is accepting applications to Round 8 of the Restore NY Communities Initiative grant with the purpose of providing municipalities with financial assistance for revitalization of commercial and residential properties; and

WHEREAS, municipalities may apply for up to \$2,000,000 and eligible projects must demolish, deconstruct, rehabilitate and/or reconstruct vacant, abandoned, condemned and surplus properties; and

WHEREAS, criteria for successful grant applications include project feasibility, project readiness, location within an urban downtown, location within a Brownfield Opportunity Area, consistency with community redevelopment plan, ability to induce commercial investment, and clearly identified need; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Martinsburg has identified one property located at 5960 Main Street, the former Glenfield Elementary School, which meets the Restore NY Communities Initiative criteria; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Martinsburg Town Board finds the Glenfield Elementary School Redevelopment project to be consistent with the Town's local revitalization plans; that the proposed financing is appropriate for the specific project; that the project facilitates

effective and efficient use of existing and future public resources so as to promote both economic development and preservation of community resources; and the project develops and enhances infrastructure and other facilities in a manner that will attract, create and sustain employment opportunities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Martinsburg Town Board hereby authorizes the Supervisor to sign and submit a grant application request to Empire State Development Corporation for the Restore NY Communities Initiative.
